DO I HAVE TO TAKE PHOTOS?

It's normal to feel anxious about taking and submitting personal photos. However, they are an essential part of your Plastic Surgery journey and are used in a number of ways:

- As a planning tool for your Surgeon
- ✓ To inform your Surgical Quote
- As a baseline to measure your results

Trust us. No one is more understanding of the necessity of maintaining privacy throughout your plastic surgery journey than we are. Like other personal client information collected during your journey, your photos remain confidential.

INSTRUCTIONS

To assist your Assessment, please:

- ✓ Take photos from eye level.
- Ensure photos are clear and in focus
- ✓ Take the photos in good lighting with minimal shadows on the face.
- Take photos in front of a plain wall.
- ✓ No makeup
- Keep hair away from face and neck.
- Do not twist or tilt the neck. Instead, move the camera around your head.
- For best results, have someone else take the photo for you.
- Stay close. Your head and neck should take up most of the frame.
