INTRODUCTION

Also known as a Breast Implant Removal, Breast Revision Surgery or Augmentation Reversal, a Breast Explant involves the removal or replacement of breast implants.

Clients opt for this procedure for a range of reasons, including:

- Preference changes
- Implant complications
- Implant-related illnesses



When planning a Breast Explant, our experienced Surgeons will work you to establish the reasons behind the Breast Explant & the best way forward.

MOTIVATIONS FOR A BREAST EXPLANT

The motivations behind Breast Explants vary from client to client. When planning your procedure, our Surgeons will work with you to understand fully the reasons behind your desire for a Breast Explant.

From there, they will advise you on the best way forward. This may include removing the implants and replacing them with new ones; repositioning the existing implants; or removing the breast implants without replacing them.

PREFERENCE CHANGES

Preference changes occur over time. You may feel their implants are no longer the right size or shape, or that they've moved into the wrong position due to weight loss, weight gain or pregnancies.

IMPLANT COMPLICATIONS

Implant complications can include:

- Capsular contracture
- Implant rupture
- Folding
- Displacement
- Infection
- Silicone leakage, and deflation (of saline implants).

While these complications don't always result in a Breast Explant, if left untreated, they can lead to Implantrelated illnesses.

IMPLANT-RELATED ILLNESS

While rare, Implant-related illnesses can occur with or without prior complications.

Such illnesses may include:

- Infection/bleeding
- Necrosis or dead tissue around the breast implant
- Calcium build-up
- Breast Implant Associated Anaplastic Large Cell Lymphoma (BIA-ALCL)
- Breast Implant Illness (BII)

YOUR SURGERY | 1 - 3 hours

Breast Explant surgery takes between 1 to 3 hours. However some clients may choose to combine the surgery with a Breast Lift. In these cases, your surgery can take up to 5 hours. During surgery, clients are placed under general anaesthesia.

WHAT TO EXPECT AFTER YOUR PROCEDURE

HOSPITAL STAY | Half Day - Overnight

A Breast Explant is typically a day surgery in Australia. So, assuming good general health, you can leave hospital 2 - 3 hours after you wake. Clients undergoing the procedure in Thailand must stay overnight.



REST TIME | 5 days

Recovery periods vary. However, we advise clients that recovery for a Breast Explant is generally smoother than that of a Breast Augmentation.

Most clients experience only minimal discomfort in the days following surgery. However, clients who have experienced capsular contracture may experience more discomfort & a slightly longer recovery. Clients who undergo an Explant with a Breast Lift may feel tight & heavy for a few weeks. This is a normal part of the healing process.

Importantly, when breast implants are removed & not replaced, it can take 2 -3 weeks for the breasts to regain their volume.

To aid recovery:

- Use pain medication to manage pain.
- ☑ No returning to work for 5 days after surgery.
- No driving for 1 week after surgery.
- Avoid heavy lifting, strenuous exercise & swimming until the surgeon advises.

RECOVERY TIME | 6 Weeks




Clients can return to normal activities & moderate exercise after 6 weeks. For optimal healing, post-surgery support garments must be worn for 6 weeks.

SETTLING PERIOD | 3 - 6 Months



The breasts will settle into their new position during the first 3 - 6 months. Breast Explant scars are often inconspicuous. They heal well & begin to fade after 3 to 4 months. You're in expert hands. Our Surgeons dedicate time to understand your unique concerns & surgical objectives before tailoring a treatment plan that's right for you & your body.



PLANNING YOUR PROCEDURE

There are many things to consider when planning a Breast Explant.

Your Surgeon will be able to guide you through the planning process. However, we also recommend you familiarise yourself with the procedural options.

INCISION PLACEMENT

Typically, Breast Explants can be performed using your previous incision sites. However, in some cases, additional incisions may be needed.

YOUR TAILORED APPROACH

Given the range of client motivations behind a client to wanting the procedure, it's only natural that our Plastic Surgeons tailor their approach on a case-by-case basis.

The surgical approach will be discussed with you in detail with you prior to your surgery.



BREAST EXPLANT TECHNIQUES

There are three common approaches to Breast Implant Removal.

BREAST IMPLANT REMOVAL ONLY

To remove breast implants (without replacement or a Breast Lift), the Surgeon makes incisions in the same place as your original Breast Augmentation.

If you suffer from capsular contracture, your Surgeon will also remove the hardened capsule. This can be done in two ways:

- After the implant is removed
- Before the implant is removed, as an **En Bloc Capsulectomy**.

The En Bloc Capsulectomy technique involves removing the hardened capsule as a whole. That is, with the implant still inside.

If the implants have leaked silicone, the En Bloc Technique ensures there is no silicone left inside the body. It also allows surgeons to send the complete capsule away for pathological testing (in cases of Breast Implant Illness).

DEFLATION

Rather than undergoing surgery, a Plastic Surgeon may advise a client to have their saline implants deflated in their office under local anaesthetic.

The Deflation Technique can only be performed on clients with saline implants.

While this technique may produce the desired size reduction a client is after:

- It will not help any capsular contracture issues
- Further replacement or Breast Lift procedures may be required.

IMPLANT REMOVAL & BREAST LIFT

This option is suitable if you're removing or replacing implants & correcting ptosis (sagging) or stretching of their skin.

The two procedures are performed simultaneously. After removing the implants, your Surgeon will also remove any excess skin to tighten the breast tissue.


While your surgeon can use the client's original incision sites to perform the

initial stage of this surgery, they may need to make extra incisions to perform the Breast Lift.

There are 4 Breast Lift techniques available to surgeons (outlined below). Each technique has their benefits and result in varying degrees of lift, ranging from slight to dramatic results. Your surgeon will carefully consider the degree of ptosis & amount of skin left after the implants are removed or replaced before advising on the most suitable technique for your anatomy.


CRESCENT TECHNIQUE

- Suited to clients with minor to moderate sagging and/or small breasts.
- Provides a small degree of lift & can correct nipple asymmetry.
- Involves a half-moon shaped incision above the areola.
 A small amount of breast tissue is removed before the bottom of the incision is lifted to join the top.



PERI-AREOLAR TECHNIQUE


- Also known as the Donut Technique
- Suited to clients with minor to moderate sagging and/or tuberous breasts.
- Provides a small degree of lift; however, it can also be used to reduce areola size.
- ✓ Involves a circular incision around the areola.

VERTICAL TECHNIQUE


- Also known as the Lollipop Technique
- Suited to clients with moderate sagging & larger breasts.
- Provides a large degree of lift & projection. Can also reduce the size of the areola, elevate the nipples & result in less noticeable scarring.
- ✓ Involves 2 incisions one around the areola & the other from the areola down to the natural crease of the breast.



ANCHOR (T-LIFT) TECHNIQUE

VIEW GALLERY

- Also known as T-Lift Technique
- Suited to clients with large breasts & severe sagging.
 Commonly used for clients also having a Breast Reduction.
- Provides dramatic results
- ✓ Involves 3 incisions: a peri-areolar incision around the areola, a vertical incision from the base of the areola to the crease of the breast, and a concave incision along the crease of the breast



POTENTIAL RISKS TO CONSIDER

Most of the following possible risks & complications are ones associated with all surgeries.

RISKS & POSSIBLE COMPLICATIONS

- Surgical risks (infections, bleeding, clots, allergic reactions to medical materials)
- Reduced breast and nipple sensitivity
- Keloid or hypertrophic scarring (can be lumpy, inflamed, and itchy)
- Numbness (temporary or permanent)
- Breast deformity or ptosis (sagging)
- Breast asymmetry
- Need for further surgery to treat complications


